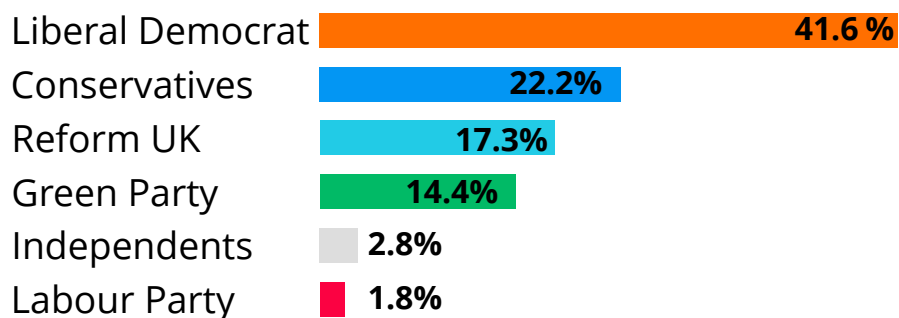

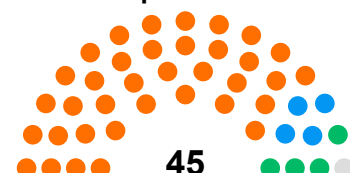

He gained the second Upper Meon Valley seat from the Conservatives, joining Jerry on the UMV team.

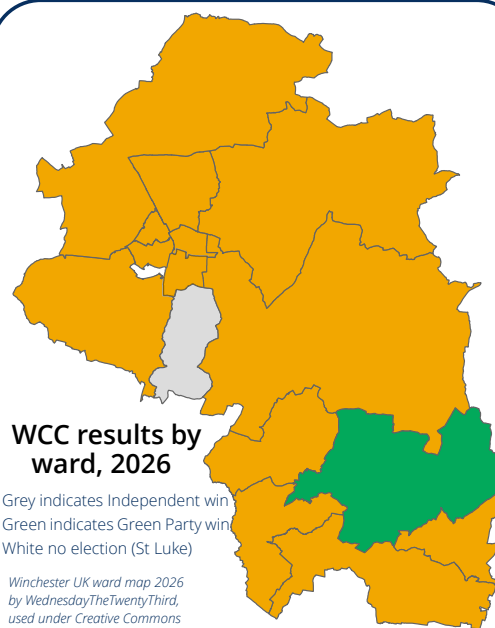
Andy Adams Wonston & Micheldever

Lib Dem City Council leader Martin Tod and some of the 36-strong Lib Dem team - proportionately, the largest ever political group on WCC.



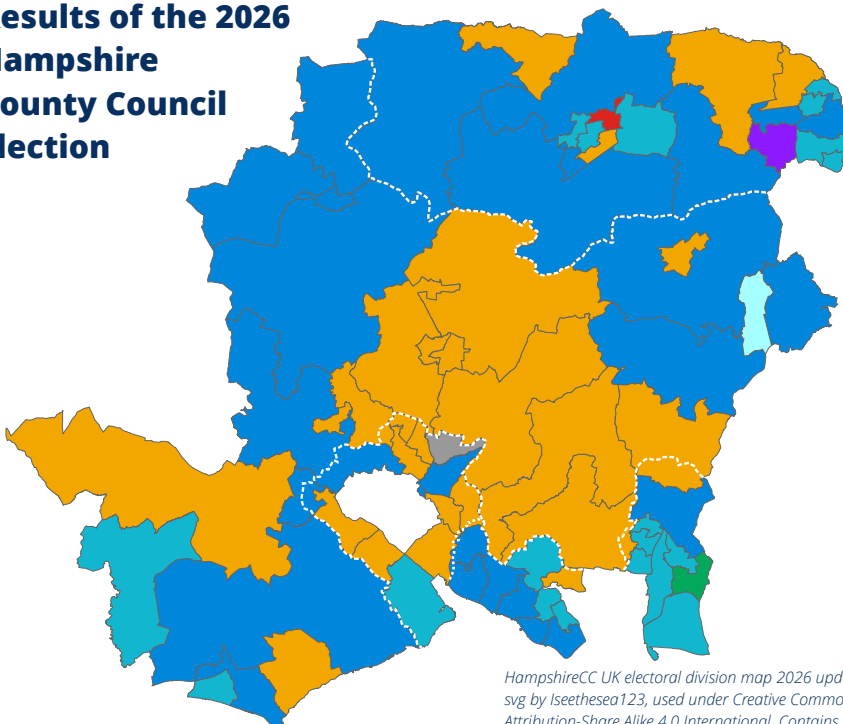

- Anne Small, Meon Valley, gain from the Green Party

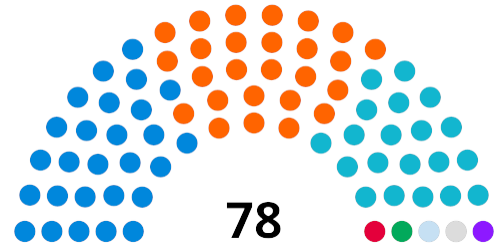
Results of the 2026 Hampshire County Council Election

Conservative-Reform stitch-up at HCC

Drama unfolded at Hampshire County Council as Conservative councillor Nick Adams-King was re-elected leader, backed by Conservative councillors, several Reform UK members and the Whitehill & Bordon Community Party. The Lib Dem candidate was supported by the Basingstoke Labour Councillor, while the Greens, most Reform councillors and independents abstained.

Conservative councillors in turn unanimously backed Reform UK councillors to chair key Committees, including vital children's services, overseeing roads and potholes and the audit committee responsible for scrutinising council finances.

Winchester Lib Dem leader Martin Tod said: **"Other parties promised to stop Reform UK at the most recent elections - but they didn't vote that way. The Conservatives and Reform UK are now working hand in hand. That can only be bad news for Hampshire residents."**
